

Tan France is an award-winning global media personality and style icon, celebrated for his work as a designer, New York Times best-selling author, actor, producer, and television personality who has helped shape the fashion and entertainment landscape.

Tan rose to international stardom as the witty and charming fashion expert on Netflix's Emmy-winning series "Queer Eye," which recently concluded with its milestone tenth and final season. "Queer Eye" is the longest-running unscripted Netflix series and continues to hold the record for the most wins in the Emmy Awards' Outstanding Structured Reality Program category. Tan has captured hearts around the world, redefining style, representation, and acceptance one makeover at a time alongside the Fab 5.

Tan served as a host and producer for "Dressing Funny", the Emmy-nominated and Webby Award-winning digital series for Netflix is a Joke. In the series, he brought his signature humor and fashion expertise to celebrity makeovers, with stars including Tina Fey, Amy Poehler, and John Mulaney. In 2025, Tan also launched his digital culinary series "Forking Fab," highlighting his love of food and cooking recipes inspired by global cuisines.

Tan also appeared as the co-host of the critically acclaimed design competition series, "Next in Fashion," alongside Gigi Hadid. Additionally, he hosted the relaunch of the global hit "Say Yes to the Dress" for Warner Bros. Discovery UK, bringing his expertise to one of television's most beloved franchises. In 2023, Tan hosted Netflix's highly-anticipated reunion for season 7 of the hit show "Selling Sunset" as well as "The White Lotus" Season 3 finale panel in 2025, facilitating a Q&A with the cast including Leslie Bibb and Walton Goggins to celebrate the Thailand-set season's conclusion. Recently, Tan appeared on the second season of Meghan Markle's Netflix series, "With Love, Meghan".

Tan took on the deeply personal subject of colorism in the BBC documentary "Beauty and the Bleach" in 2022. The powerful film explored societal biases surrounding skin tone and showed Tan opening up about his own experiences with skin bleaching, sparking important conversations around identity and representation.

Foraying into scripted television, Tan guest starred as 'Zubair' in the first season of Hulu's "Deli Boys", alongside Poorna Jagannathan. Other credits include the Emmy-winning animated series "Big Mouth" created by Nick Kroll, "Crazy Ex-Girlfriend" starring Rachel Bloom, and the animated series "Princess Power" executive produced by Savannah Guthrie and Drew Barrymore, where he voiced a gay dad, reflecting the importance of LGBTQ+ representation in modern families.

Most recently Tan announced was announced as a co-producer of "The P Word", Waleed Akhtar's Olivier Award-winning play that is returning to London's Bush Theatre from May 28 - June 27, 2026. "The P Word" follows the parallel lives of two gay Pakistani men under the UK's hostile environment policy against migrants. Tan's personal experience growing up in a South Asian Muslim household in the UK drew him to the critically-acclaimed project.

Expanding his presence in live events, Tan has become a trusted and charismatic host across major cultural moments. Tan co-hosted the 30th Annual Screen Actors Guild Awards Official Pre-Show in 2024 alongside Elaine Welteroth to interview nominees and highlight the best fashion looks of the night, which streamed live on Netflix, YouTube, and TikTok and marked Netflix's first live awards show. Additionally, Tan co-hosted the Vanity Fair Oscar Party 2024 livestream with Michelle Buteau and returned to co-host again in 2025 alongside Paige DeSorbo and Hannah Berner. Alongside the "Queer Eye" Fab 5, Tan hosted Elton John's annual AIDS Foundation Academy Awards viewing party in 2020.

Tan also expanded his creative vision with the launch of his own production company, French Tuck Media, focusing on authentic, impactful storytelling that amplifies diverse voices and perspectives.

Beyond the screen, Tan released his New York Times best-selling memoir in 2019, "Naturally Tan," a candid and inspiring account of his journey growing up in a South Asian Muslim household in the UK to becoming a global style icon.

From his early days secretly attending fashion school while working in his grandfather's denim

Factory, to starting his career behind the scenes at successful brands like Kingdom & State and Rachel Parcell Inc., to becoming one of the industry's most recognizable and respected voices, Tan continues to inspire and empower audiences with his passion, charisma, and commitment to celebrating individuality.
